Raising Broilers Broilers are hybrid chickens bred for fast growth and finish Typically raised to about 5 pounds, they are usually processed between 7 and 9 weeks of age Birds slaughtered between 9 and 12 weeks of age, typically weigh between 7 and 10 lbs and are called roasters
